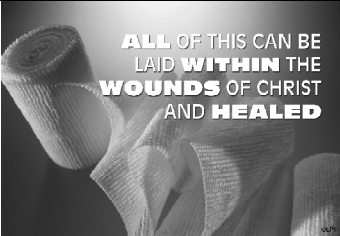
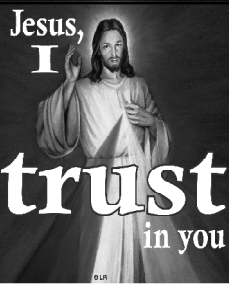

Whereas they had originally been a sign of the tragedy and pain of the crucifixion, they now became a sign of triumph and power over physical death as well as spiritual death-sin. When Jesus invites Thomas to touch his wounds, he is allowing Thomas to experience this reality for himself. Thomas doesn’t just look at the nail marks; he personally encounters them. He puts himself into the now-glorified wounds of Jesus. And then, he believes. This encounter not only takes away Thomas’ doubt but also allows him to share in the joy of Christ’s victory. “My Lord and my God!” Thomas exclaims. This is a powerful image for the mercy of Christ. The suffering he endured on the cross was not just a distant symbol for us to admire. It was not just an opportunity for him to surprise everybody by rising from the dead. The fact that Jesus suffered for us means that our suffering now has somewhere to go. Our pain, our battle with sin, our struggle to truly believe in him, all of this can be laid within the wounds of Christ and healed. When we carry our scars alone, they blind us. They paralyze us. They prevent us from experiencing joy. But when we unite our own wounds to those of Christ, when we allow ourselves to encounter the wounded but glorified Christ, we are able to move beyond our own troubles. We get to share in the victory and stop hiding in the sadness of our self-doubt. It is through this honest encounter with the risen Christ that we are truly able to experience his peace.

 El Evangelio nos traza un camino nuevo 2º DOMINGO DE PASCUA “Todos los hermanos acudían asiduamente a escuchar las enseñanzas de los apóstoles, vivían en comunión fraterna y se congregaban para orar en común y celebrar la fracción del pan” (Hechos 2, 42). En estos días de Pascua que apenas comienzan, queremos encontrar a Jesús resucitado tal como los primeros discípulos: en la convivencia de cada día y en la Eucaristía. Para reconocerlo donde él se encuentra necesitamos un corazón inquieto que nunca deje de buscarlo. Jesús llamó “bienaventurados” a los que creían en él sin haberlo visto. Sin embargo, hoy nos enfrentamos ante un incrédulo Tomás que cuestiona la resurrección de Jesús. ¿Cómo comprobarlo? ¿Es posible practicar la vida sintiendo la presencia de Jesús resucitado? La Pascua nos invita a abandonar nuestro estilo de vida viejo. Ahora somos nuevos en Cristo. Estamos para dar testimonio de la esperanza que provoca en nuestro corazón la resurrección de Cristo. El Evangelio nos traza un camino nuevo, el mismo que fue dado a los discípulos en la alborada de la Resurrección: creer en Jesús y tener fe renovada en él. Cristo, con sus manos y costado heridos, se hace presente en medio de sus discípulos. Y mediante esta experiencia ellos recuperan las fuerzas quebrantadas a causa de su muerte. Están listos ahora para la batalla de la fe. Su ministerio comienza de nuevo: se les ha capacitado para la misión confiada de continuar anunciando el Reino de Dios a los pobres. Esto conlleva el anunciarles que la misericordia de Dios es infinita y que nuestros delitos han sido lavados. ¡Ya estamos listos para compartir los mismos frutos que nos regala el Señor a cada uno de nosotros, y a la comunidad!
